

As a small charity, we have had a very busy year with around 44 boxer dogs helped into a new life healthy and happy.



More recently, Noah has come into our care when found wandering the streets of Torquay thin and cold. He did his 10 days under the watchful eye of the charity working with Foredowne Kennels. He was assessed as a friendly deaf dog. With support from donations of Natural Instinct Raw Food and cash donations to give him the very best nutrition, he is currently being brought back to condition. He suffered a set back because he was so malnourished

and caught kennel cough, nursed in foster home and neutered because he is rather amorous with doggies he meets. Noah is looking for a forever home fostered in Buckfastleigh.

This then gave me the opportunity to give my time to the rescue and foster others, give them a family environment they needed until a forever home was found. Trustees Annual Report 2013

As trustees of Cornwall & South Devon Boxer Rescue, we are reporting on our accomplishments and achievements this past year.

We have had a busy time this year with 46 boxer dogs rehomed this year. We have had a lot of elderly dogs pass over the bridge on foster, Beej 10, & Marley 10 in Totnes, Sara 12 in Newton Abbot but Sally 13 in Brixham, George 10 in Paignton, Hugo 11 & Buster aged 10 all still are in long term foster homes.

We have kept afloat again this year given the current financial climate. A great boost was the introduction of monthly donations in lieu of membership which has enabled the charity to keep afloat beautifully, although there has been some tentative moments, the continued support of the members and friends have enabled us to keep our heads above water.

Our fundraising events this year were fabulous and the sun shone bright we managed to raise around £900 on our event, which covered vet bills and outstanding debts and also paid for the annual insurances

needed to run a charity. Virgin Giving with gift aid greatly boosts our fundraising attempts with direct payments weekly into our charity account. This service is not just for fundraising, but also donations monthly or one off also with an automatic GIFT AID to boost our funds. We continue to receive discount at the vets we use in Cornwall and seek discount for those in other areas. The kennels continue to provide a wonderful service enabling us to place dogs into emergency care when foster homes are not available to them.

Our aims from last year and their results.

- To Source more foster carers, having two failed foster homes this year, we have had to try hard to find new foster homes suitable for rescue boxers. Mandy in Totnes has failed miserably with 2 sweethearts that came to us, Peggy and Milly. Lesly and Ronald have failed and fallen in total love with Pip. For all their hard work over the years and never letting us down we thank them for their continued support. On the plus side, we have 2 new foster homes, limited, but nonetheless important to our charity, welcoming Kelly & Graham from Buckfastleigh and Zoe in Exeter for their offer of support. If you know of anyone willing to lend a helping hand, sofa, space in their heart, please we do need more foster carers.
- To source more help in other towns to fundraise. Zoe has stepped forward to help in the Exeter area as coordinator and is also a wonderful fosterer. Fundraising in the area has been supported greatly and are looking forwards to even more events. If you wish to offer help in fundraising in your area, please contact us and we will provide ideas, posters and support.
- <u>To increase our membership</u> currently at 33 *lower this year to 23* not a good start so this still has to be worked on. Monthly membership is simple using virgin giving.
- <u>To have a long term plan</u> eventually leading to land and our own kennels would be the high point of our charity. *Financially a big leap, health issues of the committee to take into account. Once again on our list.*



CHRISTMAS HAZARDS

A med to large size dog would need only 2 bars of a good quality chocolate to cause a toxic level of theobromine high enough to lead to death if not treated quick enough. If your dog eats any chocolate what so ever, then contact your vet asap for treatment.

Other items found around Christmas time that are not pet friendly and potentially toxic are;

- Mistletoe
- Holly
- Ivy
- Lillie's
- Batteries
- Bones

- Nuts
- Avocado
- Onions
- Human
 Medications
- Antifreeze



Rock Salt Poisoning

During winter there is also a risk to your pets from rock salt. Rock salt is a mixture of salt (sodium chloride) and grit, and is used to help de-ice roads in winter. Rock salt can be a danger to pets such as dogs and cats, if they lick it from their paws or fur. It is difficult to say how much needs to be eaten for signs of toxicity to be seen. Even a small amount of pure salt can be very dangerous to pets. Most cases involve animals that have walked through gritted snow and then lick or chew it off their paws as they can find it irritating. It is therefore important to thoroughly wipe your pet's feet and the fur on his/her legs and tummy after a walk or time outside.

spending 4/5 months in foster care getting the best of care whilst trying to get to the bottom of her allergy related skin condition. We tried long and hard to get her to a manageable condition where she was on our favourite brand of dog food BURGESS
